<p>#1 Thomas Sutterfield, Esquire (lawyer)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Lives in Hyde Park with his wife and two children <input type="checkbox"/> Only member of his immediate family to contract cholera. <input type="checkbox"/> Won most recent case defending a Broad Street butcher accused of selling spoiled meat. <input type="checkbox"/> Recovering 	<p>#2 Matilda Wright, Wealthy 90-year old spinster</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Lived alone (with her three servants) in the family mansion in Marston Court. <input type="checkbox"/> Great-aunt to Thomas Sutterfield <input type="checkbox"/> Only member of the household to contact cholera. <input type="checkbox"/> Died in a matter of hours.
<p>#3 Tolly Martin, 10 year old professional pick-pocket</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Homeless orphan who slept in doorways around Soho Square. <input type="checkbox"/> Occasionally roamed quite far from Soho looking for wealthier citizens to rob. <input type="checkbox"/> Died of cholera two days after a fist fight with another boy at Broad Street Square. 	<p>#4 Owen and Obedience Turner and their three children</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Lived on Paddy Lane behind the butcher shop on Broad Street. <input type="checkbox"/> Owen Turner, who was lame, earned small change cleaning up the day's slop at the butcher shop. <input type="checkbox"/> Entire family died of cholera.
<p>#5 Nine Families on Butcher Lane</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> 37 individuals dead; 8 recovering 	<p>#6 Twelve Families on Ely Street</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> 60 individuals dead; 10 recovering
<p>#7 Slye Children, ages 7, 8, and 10</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Three of the eight children of Gideon and Lucy Slye. <input type="checkbox"/> Gideon Slye is a Broad Street butcher accused of selling spoiled meat. <input type="checkbox"/> Slye family recently moved to King's Cross from Broad Street and now have indoor plumbing. <input type="checkbox"/> When not in school, three of the Slye children often accompanied their father to work and played on Broad Street Square. <input type="checkbox"/> These are the only family members to contact cholera. <input type="checkbox"/> Two died; one recovering. 	<p>#8 Mucky Johnson, 18, delivery boy from Coventry Circle</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Delivered fresh seafood from Coventry Market to wealthy homes in Marston Court. <input type="checkbox"/> Often stopped to eat lunch and talk to people on Broad Street Square; said the water from the Broad Street pump was the best in the city. <input type="checkbox"/> Died of cholera.
<p>#9 John and Mary Canty, tinkers from Soho</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Pulled their cart through wealthy neighborhoods mending pots and pans for the well-to-do. <input type="checkbox"/> Often stopped to visit John's ailing mother who lived on Butcher Lane <input type="checkbox"/> Both died of cholera. 	<p>#10 Twenty-five families on Queen's Row</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> 89 individuals dead; 31 recovering
<p>#11 Eighteen families on Paddy Lane</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> 89 individuals dead; 7 recovering
