All enrolled students of West Baton Rouge Parish Schools are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school at no charge to your household each day of the 2021 - 2022 school year.

No further action is required of you. Your child(ren) will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay a fee or submit a meal application.
